Program Requirements:

The psychology program is designed to provide students with a strong foundation in the area of general psychology, in addition to concentrations in human relations, or human services.

The Psychology program is designed to provide the student with insights about the individual and his or her world. It is primarily concerned with analysis of the relationships between scientific theory and basic research in discovering, understanding, and integrating the fundamental laws of behavior. Major theories, methodological approaches, and applications of psychological knowledge are stressed in the areas of sensation and perception, learning and cognitive processes, motivation and emotion, development, personality, social psychology, intelligence, counseling and psychotherapy, and abnormal psychology.
