Richardson Learning Center (computers, tutoring, and Testing Center), campus library, and the Center City Café (serving full meals and snacks) staffed by MCCC culinary students.

Students can earn degrees in the MCCC Criminal Justice and Liberal Arts programs entirely at the Trenton Campus, which is also home to the college’s newly developed Fashion/Apparel Design and Fashion Merchandising programs. GED and English as a Second Language (ESL) instruction and short-term options through the Career Training Institute are also offered, as is a full complement of educational and enrichment programs for the city’s youth through Youth College.

Located at 102 North Broad Street between Hanover and Academy Streets, the campus is nestled between the Trenton Public Library, the YWCA, and the Daylight Twilight High School.

## Community Education and Training

The Community Education and Training department provides Adult Basic Education (ABE), High School Equivalency (HSE), and English as a Second Language (ESL) instructional activities to Mercer County residents. The department also provides short-term skills training and job placement for adults seeking employment in high-demand occupations through the Career Training Institute (CTI).

To enroll in ABE/HSE classes, individuals must be at least 16 years old and not enrolled in adult secondary education. Instruction in reading, writing, math, science and social studies is provided to help students prepare for the HSE exam. HSE testing is available on-site. Classes meet during morning and evening hours. The English Language Institute (ELI) offers additional instructional activities focused on English language acquisition.

The Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) or the Best Literacy assessment is used for placement and tracking student progress. Support services including tutoring and advising are provided to help students meet their educational goals. Assistance with career exploration and transitioning to post-secondary opportunities is provided to help individuals prepare for 21st century jobs. Call (609) 570-3185 today for more information.

## Placement Testing

A placement test measuring English and mathematics skills is a requirement in the MCCC admissions process to determine student eligibility for certain courses and programs. The exam does not affect admission to the college. Completed in approximately two and a half hours, the test includes a timed essay followed by untimed multiple choice questions. Prospective students are encouraged to thoroughly review the sample essays and practice questions found in the placement testing section of the MCCC website.

### EXEMPTIONS FROM TESTING

- 540 on the SAT critical reading exempts students from the English testing;
- 530 on the SAT mathematics exempts students from the basic math testing, but qualifies students for college-level math placement testing;
- 21 on Math ACT and 21 on Reading ACT exempts students from the English and basic math testing and qualifies students for the college-level math placement testing;
- A degree from an accredited U.S. college or university (transcript required);
- Evidence (college transcript) of college-level English or mathematics courses.

All documentation of scores and transcripts should be submitted to the Enrollment Services Office upon application to the college.

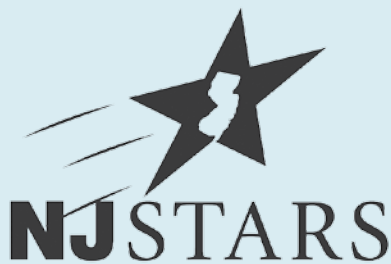

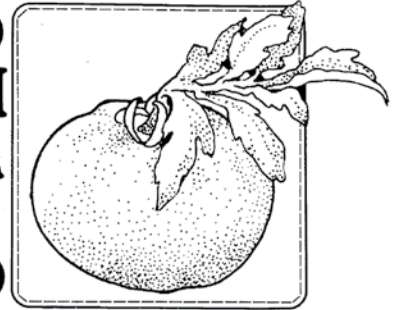

## Payment and Refund Policies

Deadlines for refund eligibility and avoiding Late Registration fees: Please note the “Key Dates” specified at left.

A one-time \$35 Late Registration fee is charged beginning on the first day of each term.

Full refunds are available only for classes dropped before the first day of the associated term. Deadlines for partial refund eligibility differ according to term length, as follows:

- 15-week terms: 50% refunds are available for classes dropped within the *first seven days* of the associated term (NOT the *class* start date).
- Terms shorter than 15 weeks: 50% refunds are available for classes dropped within the *first two days* of the associated term (NOT the *class* start date).

A course dropped anytime after refund eligibility for that course ends will be processed as a withdrawal. No refund of tuition or fees will be made to a student who is withdrawn from a course by an instructor due to non-attendance or who is dismissed from the college for cause.

*Please be aware that dropped classes or withdrawals can cause adjustments to any financial aid awards, resulting in a balance being due to the college for tuition.*

# Paying for Your Education

Community colleges charge the lowest tuition and fees of all higher education institutions. Mercer County Community College receives significant support from Mercer County and the State of New Jersey, but courses are not free. Students are required to pay for a portion of their education. To determine the cost of a course, consider tuition and college fees, special course fees, books and supplies.

## Tuition and Fees

Tuition and college fees are calculated on a per-credit basis. The table on page 24 will help you determine how much you owe based upon the total number of credits you are taking and your residency. Besides regular tuition and college charges, some courses carry an additional fee.

## Books and Supplies

Students must purchase their own textbooks and supplies. The Mercer Bookstore (see page 21 for hours and locations, or order online at [www.mccc.bkstr.com](http://www.mccc.bkstr.com)) guarantees the availability of these for any course offered at MCCC. Costs range from \$1 to more than \$150, with the average course costing \$100. Acceptable methods of payment include cash, credit card, and financial aid (checks not accepted). Textbooks can also be rented; please see website for details.

## Monthly Payment Plan

Students may apply online for interest-free payments. Enrollment for automatic monthly payments is required.

### To Enroll:

2. Click on "Enroll in a plan for the first time" (even if you have enrolled in prior terms)

### Payments Due:

A \$50 non-refundable fee plus the first payment is due upon enrolling in the payment plan. To guarantee your class schedule, payment arrangements must be made prior to the payment due date specified on your class schedule.

### Forms of Payment:

Payments to Sallie Mae can be made by check, electronic check, or credit card (MasterCard, Discover, American Express, Visa).

## Payment of Course Costs

Tuition and fees are due by Friday, April 11, 2014 for all Summer semester students who have registered by that date. After that date, payment is due when you register. You can pay by cash, check, money order, VISA, MasterCard, American Express or Discover. Payment can be made in person, by mail or at [www.mccc.edu](http://www.mccc.edu) if you use a credit card. Questions about your bill should be directed to the Bursar's office at (609) 570-3499 or 3159.

## Financial Aid

You will be considered for federal, state and MCCC financial aid if you complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov).

Our financial aid staff can answer your questions and may be able to help you complete the forms. However, processing may take up to 60 days, so apply as early as possible — even before completing an application for admission.

## Unemployed?

Tuition may be waived for unemployed persons during **Late Registration only**. Consult your local unemployment office for benefit details. Students are responsible for paying any applicable fees and for covering expenses for textbooks and other class materials.

## Senior Citizens

Mercer County residents who are 65 or older may enroll in courses without paying full tuition — but paying all fees — if seats are available in a class after paying students have registered. To take advantage of this opportunity, senior citizens must register in person at either the West Windsor or Trenton campus and pay the applicable semester fees.

Most **Summer** classes, six weeks in duration, typically begin the third week in May and the first week in July. **Winter Session**, with on-campus classes lasting four weeks and MercerOnline classes lasting for six, begins the third week in December.

We recommend that you confirm with your home college/university that they will accept the credits that you intend to obtain from Mercer County Community College.

After completing your course at MCCC, request an official transcript to be sent back to your college from MCCC.
