The FAFSA Deadline for Renewal of State Aid for Academic Year 2020-21 is Now June 1, 2020

The New Jersey Higher Education Student Assistance Authority (HESAA) recently announced that the deadline for current students to renew State financial aid will be extended to June 1, 2020. Originally slated for an April 15, 2020 deadline, the timeline was extended to June 1 to meet the needs of students and families whose ability to complete financial aid forms has been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Students have an additional six weeks to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the New Jersey Alternative Financial Aid Application for NJ Dreamers if they are "renewal students" in the current academic year who are receiving a New Jersey Tuition Aid Grant (TAG), Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG), Governor's Urban Scholarship (GUS), and/or New Jersey Student Tuition Assistance Reward Scholarship (NJSTARS and NJSTARS II). Renewal students who plan to re-enroll in the upcoming academic year at a New Jersey higher education institution are now eligible for a one-time filing extension to June 1, 2020.

All students are encouraged to complete the FAFSA well before the June 1 deadline. The sooner students apply, the earlier they can find out about available State financial aid and make informed decisions about the 2020-2021 academic year. While the April 15 deadline for renewal students is now extended to June 1, 2020, the State aid application deadline will remain September 15, 2020 for new students enrolling for the first time in the fall 2020 semester.

There are many forms of financial aid, including federal, state and institutional, and the members of Mercer's Financial Aid office are happy to explain the ins and outs of the options.


Members of the Financial Aid staff have been out in full force to help students complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Staffers also make themselves available to provide general financial aid information to the public.





Some, such as administrative specialist II Rose Del Valle, led FAFSA workshops out in the community. Del Valle's presentation was made to a local church's youth group based in Trenton.

Others, including office manager Rashaun Jones (not pictured), were out in the community making FAFSA presentations at Nottingham and Trenton Central high schools. Many organizations, including HESAA, the EOF Program (MCCC, and Rider and Georgian Court universities), The Upward Bound Program, Educational Talent Search, and Urban Academic Academy are some of the participating entities that come together to service students during events such as FAFSA Days, requested Financial Aid Workshops, as well as the Annual EOF Fair.

HELP IS AVAILABLE TO MCCC STUDENTS IN NEED

Mercer County Community College has begun the process of distributing about \$1.9 million in direct aid to students, made available through the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. In addition to potential help with tuition and fees, eligible expenses include any financial obligation that could prevent a student from completing his or her education, including housing, child care, transportation, or access to technology. Currently enrolled students, and those who will be enrolled for summer and fall semesters, are eligible to apply. **Students must complete both the 2019-20 and 2020-21 FAFSAs (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to be considered for this aid.** To expedite the distribution process, MCCC has created a simple online application for students, which is available at www.mccc.edu/CARES.
