

2025-2026 Homeless Unaccompanied Youth Determination Form

You indicated on your 2025-2026 FAFSA that you were a homeless unaccompanied youth. Unaccompanied homeless youth are young people who lack safe, stable housing not in the care of a parent or guardian. They may have run away from home, forced to leave by their parents and live in a variety of temporary situations, including shelters, the homes of friends, relatives, cars, campgrounds, parks, abandoned buildings, motels, bus or train stations. The Office of Financial Aid at Mercer County Community College is required to request and review documentation to support your status. Failure to submit any requested documentation will result in you being ineligible for Federal student aid.

 - 1. A McKinney-Vento School District Liaison
 - 2. A Director/Designee of a HUD-funded shelter
 - 3. A Director/Designee of a RHYA-funded shelter

*Documentation from sources listed above must be dated on or after July 1, 2024.

- □ **Circumstance 2:** If you cannot obtain documentation from one of the above listed individuals, submit the following:
 - 1. A statement summarizing a) circumstances that resulted in you supporting yourself b) how you support yourself c) your housing situation

*The Office of Financial Aid may request additional documentation.

- □ **Circumstance 3:** If you do not qualify as an unaccompanied homeless youth, or youth at risk of homelessness, you must do the following:
 - 1. Correct the information submitted on your 2025-2026 FAFSA
 - 2. Provide your parent(s) information & signature on the FAFSA for re-processing
