Mercer County Community College celebrates Black History Month 2023 with a full slate of events. Students, alums and community members are all encouraged to attend!



"In this moment, we say 'Thank You' to those on whose shoulders we stand today, and 'we are not done' to those who will follow in our footsteps," said Carter.
